

The genesis of the Women's Council of the National Association of Real Estate Brokers, Inc. was born over 60 years ago with the inception of the parent organization NAREB. NAREB's formation in 1947 involved eleven men and one women, Mrs. Naomi Black of Detroit, Michigan. In 1948, at the first NAREB convention, a major highlight was the role of women in the National Association of Real Estate Brokers. It was officially determined that women brokers would be recognized in two capacities: (1) The participation of women in the election process as officers; and (2) The appointment of women to offices in NAREB. By the time the fifties roared in, women were joining NAREB at an incredible rate. The vision and determination of a few women made the Women's Council of NAREB a reality; and at the NAREB Convention in 1971, in Atlanta, Georgia, the Council was formed and organized. The Women's Council represents the largest of NAREB's ten affiliate organizations.



ACME AWARD

The ACME Award was established in 1993 under the presidency of Katrina D. Henry. This is the Women's Council most prestigious award. Presented annually, the ACME recipient must be an outstanding woman that has demonstrated by honorable reputation, probity and the distinction of multiple accomplishments, a positive impact in the African American Community; in the field of business, politics or social services. The first recipient of this distinguished award was Sarah Knight Preddy of Las Vegas, Nevada in 1993. She was a Community Activist, Real Estate Pioneer and Political Figure. She was also the Owner of the first African American night club and hotel in Las Vegas. Mrs. Preddy was awarded \$1 million dollars in 1992 by the city of Las Vegas to restore her historical icon for museum exhibiting.

Alexandria Johnson Boone is President and CEO of GAP Communications Group, a full-service public relations, advertising, marketing and special events firm based in Cleveland, Ohio. Under her leadership, GAP has gained local, regional and national recognition for its quality public relations, publicity and marketing services and its signature special events. She is also widely recognized and respected in the communications and public relations industry as the architect of the LeBron James media persona.

Alex is also the Chairwoman and Founder of the Women of Color Foundation, a 501c3 organization, dedicated to the education, empowerment, training and leadership defall colors. Over the years, the Foundation has produced several annual personal and

velopment of women and girls of all colors. Over the years, the Foundation has produced several annual personal and professional development retreats, conferences, awards luncheons, and other special events across the region

She is a graduate of the Cleveland Public Schools. She also holds a master's degree from the Weatherhead School of Management at Case Western Reserve University; a Certificate from the Amos Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth College; and was a 1997 National Fellow at the Boston University School of Public Health's Join Together Program. She was also a member of the Leadership Cleveland Class of 1988.

In 2014, she founded C L Magazine, a career and lifestyle digital magazine for women and girls of color. The magazine has been continuously in publication since that time.

Some of her community involvements have included serving as a member of the Board at The Club at Key Center; The SHINE Foundation; The Urban League of Greater Cleveland; the Community Advisory Board of The Flora Stone Mather Center for Women; The Visiting Committees at the Weatherhead School of Management & the Office of Inclusion, Diversity and Equal Opportunity at Case Western Reserve University; and the Board of Directors of the Greater Cleveland Partnership, all located in Cleveland, Ohio; and the Urguhart Memorial Foundation located in Scottsdale, Arizona.

Boone has also received several awards for her business and professional achievements and community service.

Her 2016 awards and recognitions include the following: 2016 Recipient of the "National ColorComm Circle Award" for Outstanding Achievement by a Woman of Color in the Communications Industry; 2016 Trailblazer of the Year by the Ohio River Valley Women's Business Council at their Annual Regional Conference; 2016 Business Trailblazer of the Year by the Christian Business League; 2016 Recipient of the Greater Cleveland Community Service Award by the Gloria Pointer Foundation; and the 2015 recipient of the Elite Women Around the World's, Women Who Changed the World Award.

In 2017, Alex was selected for inclusion in the Inaugural "Women WELDing the Way" 2018 Business Success Calendar by the Women for Economic and Leadership Development (WELD), Cleveland Chapter; and was included in a local PBS television mini-documentary, highlighting Cleveland Black professional women and their success in spite of facing racism during their careers.

During 2018, Boone was a featured presenter at the Northeast Ohio Women's Leadership Conference; was featured in an article in the March issue of Cleveland's Smart Business Magazine, highlighting her work with the Women of Color Foundation. Additionally, the Women of Color Foundation was recognized as the "2018 Organization that Empowered Women" at the Smart Business Magazine Annual Women's Awards Breakfast.

Also, in 2018 Alex began hosting the radio show "C L Magazine LIVE!" on Cleveland's WOVU-FM Radio, 95.9.

In 2019, Alex was tapped as a "Smart Women" guest columnist in the May 2019 Issue of Smart Business Magazine; was invited to attend the prestigious WELD Leadership Conference and Corporate Board Track Program in Columbus, Ohio; was a keynote speaker for the Bowling Green State University, Women in Leadership Conference, hosted by their College of Business; was a keynoter at the Cleveland WELD Diversity & Inclusion Workshop; selected to receive the first-ever, Cleveland Realtist Association's Community Service Award; and was named a "Sheroe" by the MetroHealth System for her work on behalf of women and girls of color in Northeast Ohio.


